Tilda "Seay" Pace, age 89, Russellville passed away Sunday, September 23, 2007. The visitation will be an all night vigil from 6 p.m. Tuesday, September 25, 2007 until 2 p.m. Wednesday, September 26, 2007 at Oak Grove Freewill Baptist Church, Russellville. The 2:00 pm funeral service will follow in the church with Bro. Curtis Taylor officiating. Interment will be in East Franklin Cemetery.
